QUALITY REPORT

The Board of Directors of Cascade River Community Club (CRCC) hereby provides to you, the members of CRCC, with this annual water quality report. The purpose of this report is to keep you informed about the quality of water provided by the club. This report covers water quality testing during calendar year 2009. CRCC is pleased to report that its drinking water is safe and meets federal and state requirements.

CRCC's drinking water source is from Source SO3 (Well #2) located near the west end of Cascade River Park, Division I. This well draws from an aquifer near the Cascade River. Because Well #2 is a shallow well (about 32 feet deep), has a seal depth less than 18 feet (15 feet), and does not draw from a confined aquifer (close to the Cascade River), the Washington State Department of Health (DOH) rates the well as highly susceptible to intrusion from surface water sources. However, no contaminants from surface sources have been detected to date in water from the well. For added safety and in accordance with DOH direction, CRCC chlorinates the water.

P. O. Box 174, Marblemount, WA, phone 360-873-4208. You can also attend any of the CRCC Board meetings normally held on the third Saturday of every month at 9:00 AM at the Marblemount, WA community hall.

All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may contain small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of these contaminants does not necessarily pose a health risk. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground before eventually reaching the CRCC well, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and may pick up substances resulting from animal or human activities. Possible contaminants include microbes such as viruses or bacteria, inorganic substances such as naturally occurring salts or metals, organic chemicals associated with fertilizers or septic systems, and naturally occurring radioactive minerals. To ensure safe drinking water the DOH and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) prescribe limits in the amount of certain contaminants in public water systems. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

The CRCC water system is routinely tested for contaminants according to federal and state laws. The table below shows the test results from January 1 through December 31, 2009 or the last test for tests done less often than once a year. Contaminants tested but not detected are not included in the table.

Following is a list of definitions of terms and abbreviations used in the table:

MCLG - Maximum Contaminant Level Goal - The maximum contaminant level goal is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health.

MCLG's allow for a margin of safety.

MCL - Maximum Contaminant Level - The maximum contaminant level is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLG's as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

MFL - Million Fibers per Liter - A standard unit of measurement for asbestos.

N/A - Not Applicable

Y/N - Yes/No

NTU - Nephelometric Turbidity Units – A measure of water clarity ppm - Parts per million. One part per million corresponds to one minute in 2 years or a single penny in \$10,000.

ppb - Parts per billion. One part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2000 years or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Mg/L - Milligrams per liter or parts per million

µg/L - Micrograms per liter or parts per billion

SRL - State reporting level

MCLs are set at very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described for many contaminants, a person would have to drink 2 liters of water every day at the MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

There was one test showing the presence of coliform. Additional testing at five locations the following day were all successful. The last test for disinfection byproducts was conducted during a winter month. The test is required to be tested during a summer month and was repeated in August, 2009. The test was successful. [See following table.]

There were no detections in the latest testing for arsenic (September, 2003); 23 inorganic contaminants (August, 2001); 3 soil fumigants (July, 2001); 5 volatile organic contaminants (January, 2004); and radionuclides (January, 2004 and December, 2004).

In addition to the water supply and distribution system testing above, lead and copper tests were accomplished (October, 2007) by the occupants of five private residences in accordance with Department of Health requirements. These residences were occupied by members living full time in Cascade River Park. None of the residences exceeded the lead or copper action levels. The detected levels shown are 90th percentile (same as maximum for five samples).

Infants and young children are typically more vulnerable to lead in drinking water than the general population. It is possible that lead levels at your home may be higher than at other homes in the community as a result of materials used in your home's plumbing. If you are concerned about elevated lead levels in your home's water, you may wish to have your water tested and flush your tap for 30 seconds to two minutes before using tap water. Additional information is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791). Lead in drinking water is rarely the sole cause of lead poisoning, but it can add to person's total lead exposure. All potential sources of lead in the household should be identified and removed, replaced, or reduced.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/Center for Disease Control guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by cryptosporidium and other microbiological contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

CRCC personnel and member volunteers work hard to provide quality water to all members of the community. We ask that all members help to protect our water source, which is vital to the community.

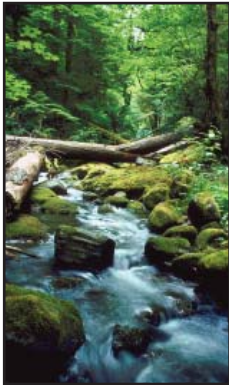

PROPOSED BUDGET 2010-2011

The proposed annual budget for fiscal year 2010-2011 is \$195,831 which is \$12,942 less than for 2009-2010. The dues plus assessment (for one lot) required for this budget total 475 dollars. This is a decrease of 36 dollars from 2009-2010. The decrease is due to several factors including reduced costs for diesel and gasoline. Water system leaks have been significantly reduced which, in turn, is expected to reduce diesel required for the system pump. Also, with the repairs to No-name Creek bridge and the wood water tank roof complete, no special projects are planned for 2010-2011. Projected income tax payments are lower, and the Park's insurance package premium is lower. Lot sales resulting from delinquency/foreclosure activities have also benefited the Park.

Calculation of the required assessment is based on the total proposed budget, projected delinquency rate, projected cash carryover, projected receipts from carried over delinquent accounts, projected interest income, the number of dues paying members, and the number of assessable lots. Details of the dues and assessment calculations will be available at the annual meeting.

The following table shows the proposed budget compared to the current (2009-2010) budget.

In Category I, Personnel Expenses, current gross wages for the Park and Relief Caretakers show an annual increase of \$1,118 and \$308 respectively. Any further increases in caretaker wages determined by the Board are covered in Category I.D., Discretionary Compensation, the latter increased by \$2,531 to allow up to 5 percent increases.

In Category II, Contracted Services, allocations for the bookkeeper and audit/tax preparation are increased by \$250 and \$750 respectively.

In Category III, Fixed Expenses, forecast income tax payments are reduced by \$2,000. Insurance premiums are reduced by \$1,552.

In Category IV, Administrative Expenses, expected business and communication expenses are expected to be lower by \$1,000. In Category V, Utilities, projected propane costs are increased by \$1,049.

In Category VI, Water, diesel fuel cost is decreased by \$5,000. Special water projects is reduced by \$4,000 (wood tank roof repair complete). In Category VII, Roads, special road projects is reduced by \$4000 (No-name Creek bridge repair complete). Category VIII, Service Equipment, shows reduced gasoline and diesel costs.

In Category IX, Park Facilities and Maintenance, costs to maintain facilities is increased by \$1,000 reflecting current experience.

In Category XII, to keep up with cost increases, the Equipment Replacement Fund allocation has been increased from \$8,000 to \$10,000.

Lastly, the contingency fund allocation, Category XIII, is reduced by \$1,500. (The fund is at an adequate level of approximately 15 percent of the total budget.)

After 34 years as budget chairperson, it is time for me to hand over this committee chair to another member. Earl Spradling has kindly volunteered and worked with me on this proposed budget. I am sure he will do a great job at this task. I also want to thank Betty Gully who served and helped so much on this committee for most of those 34 years.
